1. A lunch-size paper bag will be provided. Please write the title and your name on the front and draw/color an illustration to go along with your book.
2. **Put 4 items** in the bag that can help you retell the story. Item 1 should tell about a character. Item 2 should tell about a setting. Item 3 should tell about a problem or event in the story. Item 4 should tell the solution or ending to the story. Pictures may be drawn for 2 of these items but not all 4.
